However, if you have a relevant business degree or qualification you may get exemptions from some of the accountancy exams and this would speed up your progress. If you are currently a qualified accountant and want to work in auditing you will find the best opportunities by applying to bigger practices and also to internal audit roles often with banking and financial services.</p> <p>Long-Term To become an auditor you must first train as an accountant. You can start to train as an accountant direct from your leaving certificate but most firms would now expect you to have a business or other numerate degree before starting training to qualify as an accountant. You will need to register with one of the appropriate professional bodies and then undertake on-the-job training with part-time study and examination. The relevant bodies are: • Association of Chartered Certified Accountants • Institute of Chartered Accountants in Ireland • Institute of Certified Public Accountants in Ireland • Chartered Institute of Management Accountants CIMA The CIMA route is the one most associated with working within a company as financial controller or cost management accountant. Every university and IT has business or accounting courses and degrees that can take you in this direction. You can also study part time or distance learning for the professional exams through many of the independent private colleges such as Griffith, Independent, Galway Business School, Portobello, HSI Limerick, BPP and many others.</p>	78
